Today we are joined on the Chancel by Jamie Manirakiza, the Executive Director of Partnership to End Human Trafficking (PEHT) which is a past recipient of the Marble Easter Offering. PEHT serves all survivors of human trafficking regardless of nationality, gender identification, age, or type of trafficking experience and is located in Fairfield County, CT. According to them, "It's hard to imagine that the crime of human trafficking can happen in our own backyard. The unfortunate reality is that human trafficking occurs all around us. Millions of individuals are forced into labor or commercial sexual exploitation every year, making human trafficking the fastest-growing criminal industry in the world – second only to drug trafficking." 


