Greetings Marble Family — as we meet you in whatever space this bulletin finds you, we are delighted that you have taken the time to follow our updates on Marble's Easter Offering. Your hearts and intentions around spreading love and hope in our city and the world are aligned with Jesus' actions; we could not walk this journey without you and it is humbling to know that we all get to play a role in following God's agenda of love and hope for the world.

This week you have helped us move closer to **our goal to raise \$220,000** to distribute as grants to nonprofits dedicated to upholding basic human rights by helping to provide access to mental and physical healthcare, food, housing, education equity, no discrimination and more. **To date, you have contributed \$154,777.58.** We are **grateful for this support. In following the work of one of our Easter Offering grant applicants, **We Act for Environmental Justice**, located in Harlem, it was encouraging to learn that their executive director and founder, Peggy Shepard, spoke at President Biden's Leaders Summit on Climate, a two-day gathering of leaders from around the world to discuss how we can best work together to address the climate crisis. Peggy is also a member of the White House Environmental Justice Advisory Council. The advisory council provides advice and recommendations to the Chair of the Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) and the White House Environmental Justice Interagency Council on how to address current and historic environmental injustices, including recommendations for updating Executive Order 12898. 
